## Advent meanings

During Advent, which begins this year on December 3, many churches and families use wreaths to symbolize watchfulness and increasing joy as Christmas approaches. Colors for the candles vary, with some traditions using blue (for hope or creation) and others preferring purple (for royalty, humility or penitence).

The four candles that each represent a week in Advent also signify hope, peace, joy and love. (The third candle is often pink.) In the center is the white Christ candle, representing Jesus as the light of the world. That candle is lit on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day.

The round, green Advent wreath has special meaning of its own. It symbolizes eternal life and the unending love of God, who sent his only Son to earth to die in our place.

### God's peaceable kingdom

Once in a while — too seldom, it seems, but often enough to give us hope — Isaiah's prophecy comes true: "The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion will feed together ... The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together" (Isaiah 11:6-7, NRSV).

In February 2022, a Minnesota photographer captured a rare event: a wolf and a deer lying feet from each other in the snow — and neither was eating the other! Occasionally we hear of Palestinians and Israelis partnering to teach peacemaking skills, a rally protester helping an injured counterprotester, a crime victim and perpetrator embracing. A divorced couple I know, deeply estranged, decided they could sit together at their son's high school graduation to demonstrate their love for him.

In a world sadly torn apart, glimpses of mending, tolerance and love are signs of God among us. Isaiah (11:6) declares what makes such goodness possible: "A little child shall lead them." We know this child as the babe of Bethlehem, Jesus.

# **Getting to Know Pastor John Leek**

John Wesley Leek wants everyone to know the basics of faith and discipleship.

"Jesus said we come to him like children," he explains. "We're the ones who overcomplicate it."

His own path took unexpected turns. Though Pastor John shares a name with the founder of Methodism, he didn't become a Christian until his second year as a casino management major at the University of Southern Mississippi. He attended Asbury Theological Seminary after an employer and others helped him recognize that God was calling him to ministry.

Pastor John sees in Bethany Church a heart for community, for building up Christ's body together, and for serving beyond the church walls. "I can see that in all your mission projects. I really see that in the big commitments you have made in caring for and building up kids. I also see in you courage."

In his first few months in Berwick, he plans to focus on preaching Jesus and getting to know the congregation. Individual and small group meetings will allow him to hear what people love most about Bethany and where God may be stirring hearts for future ministry.

With two small boys and a newborn, Pastor John and wife Abby focus any free time on the family. "We try to do something outside every day, and the boys and I love reading books together. I've learned a lot about trains and all kinds of construction equipment in the past few years!"

He would love for some Bethany members to share their talents and hobbies. "I'd also love to get back to regular exercise at the gym and hope to join the YMCA."

He cites Proverbs 27:17: "As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." "Perhaps some of your especially active folks will provide some accountability!"

## Five Things Pastor John Has Learned in Ministry

#### When you see a gift in someone, point it out!

"It was an employer who pointed out that I was called to ministry. By God's grace, I came to agree with him. Only then did I find out many others had the same impression but hadn't said anything."

#### God is active in the world and changes people and circumstances all the time.

"I've seen too much to doubt. I've seen people young and old written off where God said, 'Not yet!' I've witnessed miracles. Our challenge is to have eyes to see what he's already doing.

#### People rarely become disciples of Jesus by accident.

"Simple things done consistently are what brings growth. Find ways to spend intentional time with God and with other people who love Jesus; those are the building blocks that everything else flows from."

# The great commission (Matthew 28:18-20) is our job, but the great commandment (Matthew 22:36-40) is who we are.

"We are called to be people who are being made new and into the likeness of God's son, Jesus. What I like most already about Berwick in general and Bethany Church in particular is the kind and generous attitude you share."

#### The Holy Spirit will lead us in what we are to do.

"I believe the vision for what comes in the next season will emerge from God speaking to many, and I'll be listening to hear what the Holy Spirit may be speaking through your combined time with Him."

We are hoping the church as a whole might be willing to help with donations of the things we need. This has been an ongoing project. Here are some things we need:


Individually wrapped granola bars, breakfast bars, cereal bars and similar.


