



Pastor Search Update



Our Extra Mile Giving for November will support Bethany's Little Pantry Boxes/Homeless Ministry for Harvest Home. We are asking for store gift cards from Weis Markets, Giant, IGA or monetary donations in support of our mission. We will be collecting donations throughout November. A basket will be placed on the Harvest Home table in the Overflow area during services. Harvest Home giving envelopes are also available at the reception table or information desk.

You may donate food items for Harvest Home which also would be used in our pantry box ministry. Please put your non-perishable food items and personal hygiene items on the Harvest Home table located outside the library in the Overflow area. Any items that cannot be used for the pantry boxes will be taken to the Salvation Army to support their mission of helping the community.

List of the items needed for the Little Pantry locations

We are hoping the church as a whole might be willing to help with donations of the things we need. This has been an ongoing project. Here are some things we need:

Individually wrapped granola bars, breakfast bars, cereal bars and similar.

Ramen noodles, soups, instant lunch soups, nuts, tuna pouches, individual packs of crackers, fruit cups

Hygiene products, Individually wrapped toilet paper, Hand sanitizer, Toothbrushes, Toothpaste Towels and washcloths, Soap, Drawstring garbage bags (large or kitchen size), Large or XL ziplock bags,

Tote bags--the reusable kind from grocery stores and similar. These can be used or new.




The virtues of gratefulness and generosity are connected. When we're truly thankful for all God provides, we want to sow generous seeds in other people's lives. What will be the harvest?
